

YMCA Earn Your Way To Camp Fundraiser 2010 Parent's Policy

1. An adult (over 18) must sign for all candy. A valid identification with name and address, and a valid Visa, Discover or MasterCard credit/debit card or a \$20 deposit/box, is required initially. (In other words a \$20 deposit/box is equivalent to a credit/debit card).
2. You may take up to two boxes of candy (80 bars) at one time. If you don't have a credit/debit card, you may take one box of candy at a time by leaving a \$20 deposit. (Once you sell your candy, you only have to turn in another \$20). New boxes cannot be picked up until the outstanding balance is paid in full.
3. All proceeds from sales will be credited to your family's camp account. Sellers are not entitled to cash proceeds. The account balance may be transferred to a camper(s) within the family as indicated when initially signing up to participate in the sale. If the amount is not transferred, it will go into a general camp scholarship fund. Funds cannot be transferred to another year.
4. No open boxes may be returned. Any unopened boxes must be returned to the YMCA by Thursday, April 1, 2010. Failure to do so will result in charging the outstanding balance to your credit/debit card.
5. Prizes for the top three selling families will be:
 - 1st Prize: a free week of Traditional Resident Camp at Onyahsa or Day Camp in Jamestown or Lakewood
 - 2nd Prize: one-half tuition for Traditional Resident Camp or Day Camp
 - 3rd Prize: \$50 gift certificate to Onyahsa Outfitters, the camp store
6. The candy sale ends Thursday, April 1, 2010 at 7:00 pm. In order to be eligible for the top three fundraising prizes, monies must be turned in no later than April 1. You will receive a letter indicating the total earned by May 15, 2010.
7. Please be courteous, set goals, ask relatives to sell candy at work, store candy in a cool, dry place, thank people whether they purchase candy or not, and be proud of YMCA Camping!
8. Individuals may donate a cash amount to Camp Onyahsa, which will be credited to you, if they choose not to purchase a candy bar.
9. If children sell house-to-house, make sure that they have a parents' permission, do not go to a strangers' residences, and do not go alone. You are responsible for the money, so please safeguard the money and turn it in regularly.
